

AUSTRALIA DAY – HARRINGTON

FRIDAY 26th JANUARY 2018



Meeting at Pilot Hill – at 10 am BYO morning tea - history of ship wrecks, grave stone of second pilot Joseph Bradley 1809 - 1875 (descendant of first fleeter – James Bradley his Father – *Scarborough* & Sarah Barnes his mother 3rd *Fleeter*) and much more. Directions to Pilot Hill – Turn off to Harrington from the Pacific Highway near Coopernook and follow the road east to Harrington village (about 10 km) passing both the Bowling Club, then Harrington Hotel on your right – after the Hotel you will take the second road on the left (*Pilot St*) and then first road to the right (*High St*) up to Pilot Hill.



Meeting at Crowdy-Harrington Marine Rescue at 11am for a guided tour and history of the centre. Directions to the Marine Rescue building is just below pilot hill or again passing the Harrington Hotel on your right follow the main road (*Beach St*) to the break wall on your right and the Marine Rescue building is at the commencement of the break wall on the foreshore.



Meeting at the Harrington Hotel at 12.30pm for a lunch of your choice from flathead fish 'n chips/pasta/pizza or a delicious steak – meals range from \$19 to \$28. We have an area set aside from the main dinning area overlooking the Manning River. You order at the restaurant counter and pay for your meal & drinks there.
